## ANNUAL REPORT 2014-15

Our worthy Chief Guest **Sh. College Una.

At the very outset, I would like to acknowledge, with due humility and gratefulness, the sincere efforts of the social workers, intellectuals and general public of this town, which were instrumental in the setting up of this institution in the year 1968. The efforts of our Founder Principal Sh. R.M Sharma, an able administrator and a visionary, have provided the solid foundation necessary for the further development of any budding institution. As is natural in every field, the faces of people providing administration, training and other services have changed over a period of time. But, I am of the firm belief that every one, by his devotion and dedication, has contributed to the evolution and development of Govt. College Una in five decades of its existence. ### **NCC:-**

National cadet corps(NCC) is a distinguished youth organization of the country engaged in grooming the youth-**'The Leaders of Tomorrow'**- into disciplined and patriotic citizens. Two units of NCC under Lieut.(Dr.) Ashwani Kumar and Prof. Navita Sharma are working efficiently in our college.

In this session in HP(I) COY,54 cadets(Girls and Boys) and in NCC(Girls) 41 students were enrolled. Four cadets from our college participated in Ground Level Republic Day Camp(RDC) selection organized at Shahtalai. Two out of these were further selected at Ground Level and attended Pre-RDC at NCC academy Ropar. Three cadets participated in Thal Sena Camp(TSC) at Shahtalai and cadet Lalita was further selected and participated in TSC Delhi. Eight students participated in Army Attachment Camp organized in Solan. 29 cadets participated in Combined Annual Training Camp at Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya Pekhu Bela Una.

Senior Under Officer Reena Devi and Cadet Manju Sharma attended Combined Annual Training Camp for Republic Day Parade selection at Shahtalai. Reena Devi also attended Pre RDC camp at Roopnagar and appeared for 'C' certificate exam. Girl cadets also participated in various annual training camps held in May 2014 and February 2015.

Apart from this our NCC cadets celebrated Environment Week, organized Cancer Awareness Drive and Traffic Awareness Week with rallies in the surroundings of the college. Our cadets participated in the parades organized on Himachal Day, Independence Day and Republic Day at district level functions.

### **NSS:-**

Three units of NSS are functioning under the able guidance of Dr. Indu Bala, Prof. Parveen Sankhyan and Prof. Davinder Atlas. A total of 308 volunteers-243 girls and 65 boys-have been enrolled in these units. During the academic session 10 one day camps



were organized and the volunteers participated with enthusiasm and devotion to make these camps a success. Various activities like Cleanliness campaign, Tree Plantation, Cultural programmes and awareness rallies were undertaken to spread social messages among the masses. Clean India Campaign, AIDS awareness week, Road Safety Campaign, Voters' Day were some Important events that were taken up by NSS volunteers and they were generously supported by our staff members and public in general. District Administration, HP Police, Health & Family Welfare Department also contributed with their inputs and logistical support from time to time.

The Annual NSS special Camp was organized from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 7<sup>th</sup> January 2015. 91 volunteers were a part of this camp with Mr. Naveen Krishna, President and Ms. Priya, Secretary, who discharged their duties diligently. Principal Dr. SK Chawla was the chief guest on the inaugural function. He exhorted the volunteers to take special care to keep themselves fit and healthy and reminded them that 'A Sound mind dwells in a sound and healthy body'. The key note speakers during this camp included Dr. Kohli, Civil Hospital Una, Sh. Ashok Puri DGM KCCB Una, Sh. Ratanjeet Singh, Naib Tehsildar(Elections) Asha Didi and Ms. Harpreet Kaur fom Brahamakumari Ashram. On the whole a very healthy interaction was made possible on subjects ranging from health, career, polity, elections, spiritualism etc. and our students benefitted from this camp immensely. The spirit of sharing was inculcated among the volunteers as they collected woollens, eatables, soap and detergents from their own homes to be distributed among the migrants living in village Lalsingi. These migrants were also given a briefing about the importance of hygiene in their lives. One day was devoted to trekking and a distance of above 15-20 Kms was covered. A discussion on 'Clean and Green' was enthusiastically received and it led to the formation of 'Himalayan Green Club' with Mr. Abhishek and Mr. Sameer of BA III semester being elected President and Secretary. Sh. R.P Bhardwaj Principal Govt. College Daultpur Chowk was the Chief guest on the closing function of this camp. He underlined the importance of NSS and shared vital information on Cleanliness campaign and its historical perspective with special reference to Mahatma Gandhi. Overall, it was a satisfactory year for NSS in the College.

### **IGNOU STUDY CENTRE**

A study centre of IGNOU is operational in the campus with Prof. Y.P Saini as its Coordinator. This study centre provides distance learning facilities to those who are unable to continue regular studies due to varied reasons. It is successfully running numerous courses related to arts, Commerce, Management, Computers and various PG, Diploma and Certificate courses.



**LIBRARY:-**

The College library endeavors to be a pioneer in helping educate students to become skilled, effective, responsible information users- people who recognize when they need information, and know how to find, retrieve, evaluate and use it effectively, efficiently and ethically. The College library during the reporting year has taken an entrepreneurial approach by undertaking the challenge of providing exemplary library and information resources and services in creative as well as sometimes unconventional ways. College library has provided relevant, patron-centered support both to the students and staff of the college. The Library has been shifted to a new block and furnished with new furniture and fixtures. The library resources are being automated using SOUL library software. An NLIST service, the e-resources provided by the INFLIBNET has been subscribed for the use of faculty and students. Digital section of the library is operational where Virtual Learning Resource Centre with excellent state-of -the art computer facilities having 6 Internet connected terminals with Local Area Network (LAN) are being installed.

A Parent's Teacher Association is functioning smoothly in the college under the Presidentship of Sh. Onkar Sharma. It is instrumental in giving impetus to the development of the college infrastructure.

### **NEEDS OF THE COLLEGE/VISION FOR THE FUTURE**

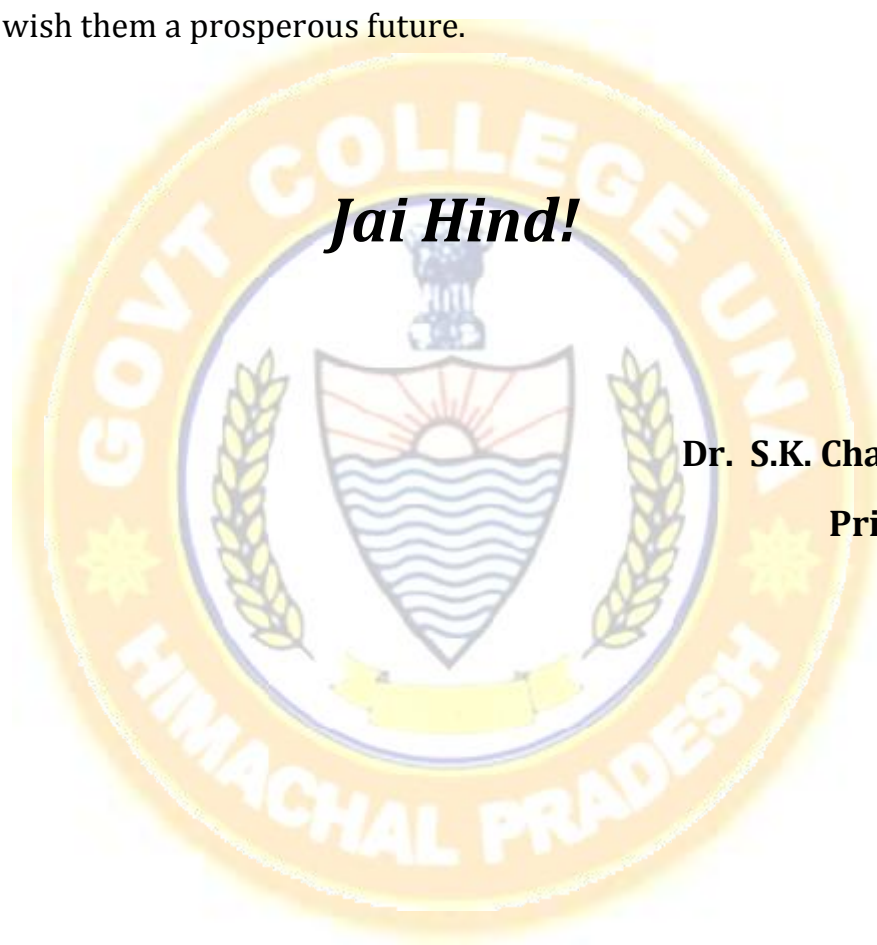
In order to provide cutting edge education, it is imperative to adopt a futuristic approach. The college has lined up some projects for the future which are important for its overall development.

- a)** Introduction of various professional courses has led for the need for construction of girls as well as boys hostel.
- b)** The college owns the largest land area in Himachal Pradesh. Therefore, more residences for the teaching and non-teaching staff should be constructed in the existing Teacher's Colony.
- c)** Keeping in view the record breaking achievements in the field of sports, a sports stadium is the need of the hour. A gymnasium and auditorium need to be constructed on priority basis.
- d)** Due to retirements and various other reasons there is a paucity of staff in the administrative department. The existing staff strength is inadequate and more posts are required to be created in order to handle the growing needs in an efficient manner.

One vacancy in Political Science has not been filled up for more than a year. Atleast one more post needs to be created in the Dept. of History. There is an urgent need for a Tabla teacher/ Instructor in the Dept. of Music.
