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

Activities conducted by Professional Courses

Department of BBA

The BBA Department, established in 2008, remained steadfast in its commitment to fostering an environment that nurtures young students into future leaders, excelling in the field of management through active participation in co-curricular activities. Throughout the year, the BCA Department orchestrated a blend of academic and co-curricular activities, aiming for the holistic development of students. These initiatives not only offered a welcome respite from routine work but also served as a

platform to discover and nurture recreational talents among the students. The department organized various activities to achieve this goal:

The commencement of the 2023-24 session kicked off with the orientation program "Aarambh," an initiative designed to explore new horizons and welcome incoming students. The BBA students achieved an impressive pass percentage of approximately 93%, with 78% securing a position in the first division. Engaging competitions such as Collage Making and Planters from Waste were organized, adding a creative and eco-friendly dimension to the students' participation. The establishment of the management club, "The Managing Falcons," aimed at honing managerial skills among the students. In a live project, students displayed their handmade Diyas and other decorative materials within the college campus. Notably, students Gurwinder and Tanya secured the second and third prizes, respectively, in the face painting competition, adding accolades to the department's achievements.

Department of BCA

During the festive season of Diwali, an engaging Art & Craft competition was conducted to enrich the overall development of students. Department of B.Voc

Department of B.Voc was started from session 2017-18. Department is providing two courses i.e. Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism. The department has 40 seats in each stream. Individual VT's for various levels, LA's for both courses and one Clerk have been provided by the government. Separate labs have been established for both the courses. Time to Time guest lectures are conducted from industry experts for both streams for their grooming and skill development. Total 152 Students were enrolled in Department of B.Voc for the session 2023-24. During the celebration of "World Tourism Week" starting from September 21, 2023, the Department organized a variety of engaging activities. These included student-led initiatives such as Food Stalls, Quizzes, Mehandi, Painting, and Declamation competitions. The dynamic week showcased the diverse talents and interests of the participants, fostering a spirit of enthusiasm and creativity within the department.

Department of MBA

MBA department organized Seven days Orientation programme 'Parichay' for the new students in the beginning of the new session. Multifarious activities such as one month Summer Internship training were organized to equip them with the current corporate protocol. MBA students from Govt. College Una secured the Best College Award at the HPTU Management Fest, excelling in management and cultural games on 26th & 27th April 2023.





The college continues to uphold its outstanding reputation in the realm of sports. In the current year, our athletes have demonstrated remarkable prowess in both Inter-College and Inter-University championships, earning Govt College Una the esteemed title of Overall Champion by HPU for 2023 in the Men's section. The Annual Athletic Meet, held on 21st Feb 2024, witnessed the spirited participation of more than 500 students, both men and women, engaging in 15 diverse events. Noteworthy achievements include Mr. Mohit Kumar and Ms. Raveena being crowned as the best athletes in their respective categories. Moreover, the college took pride in hosting the North Zone Inter University Women's Cricket Championship for the first time, a successful event spanning from 16th to 22nd November. The Inter-College Men Cricket Championship was also skillfully organized by our college. Adding to our list of accomplishments, the college served as the venue for the HP University Inter-College Hockey Championship (Men & Women) from 6th to 9th November 2023 and the H.P University Inter-College Volleyball Championship (Men) from 21st to 24th November 2023. An impressive 51 teams from various colleges participated in these events. In the Women's section of the Hockey championship, our college claimed the top position, while the Men's section secured the Runners-up position. The college actively participated in various HPU Inter-College championships, earning commendable positions. Sports Day, celebrated on 26th August 2023, showcased the talent and dedication of our athletes.





Clubs/Societies & Activities

Eco Club

The Eco Club of the college kept students engaged in various activities throughout the academic year such as clay modeling, pot decoration, plantation drives etc. Ozone day was celebrated on Sept 16, 2023.

Red Ribbon Club

Red Ribbon club of the college remained active throughout the year under the convenorship of Dr. Ranju Banota. Career Guidance Cell

Information on career guidance is integral to every educational institution. To ensure strong foothold in the field of employment, students have to be equipped with latest information on careers related to their subject. Under the supervision of a Career Guidance Cell, counseling and lectures are provided to the students of all faculties from time to

time. Throughout the course of the year, the placement season is ongoing. The Government College Una hosted the Rozgar Mela & Unnati-2023 in the 2022–2023 academic Sessions. In this rozgar mela, more than 200 students participated, around 22 companies took part, and 57 students were selected. Pre Job offers, dates of interviews, selection of candidates etc. are announced through the Training Camp, Placement Office.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a distinguished youth organization of the country engaged in grooming the youth - The Leaders of Tomorrow- into disciplined and patriotic citizens. It aims at grooming students into models of discipline and helps in the development of their character, leadership qualities, a secular outlook and the spirit of self-sacrifice to the nation.

Two units of NCC under Captain (Dr.) Ashwini Kumar and Captain Monika Khanna are working efficiently in our college. Parade Practice is held every weekend in the college and our cadets excel in complex drill formations. Besides, our cadets participated in various social activities throughout the year. Una's forest guards orchestrated a tree plantation event, joined by enthusiastic NCC cadets who planted over 100 trees along the roadside of Ghaluwal near the Sombhadra River. Cadets from Govt College Una and Govt College Beetan organized a blood donation camp on NCC day, showcasing their commitment to community service

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The National Service has been functioning with the motto "NOT ME BUT YOU" in view of making the youth inspired in the service of the community. Two units of NSS are being run in the college with the strength of 200 volunteers under the guidance of two programme officers Prof. Promila & Prof. Manjeet Singh. In this academic session various activities were organised as per the guidelines of State Government and Centre Government. A one-week special camp w.e.f. 23.01.2024 to 29.01.2024 was organised in the college campus which was inaugurated by the Dr. Satish Kumar Bansal, former Principal Govt. College Una. During this camp, guest lectures on Drug abuse & Cyber security, Corruption and Bureaucracy, Importance of health and hygiene, Women empowerment and Importance of Yoga in our daily life were organised. Cleanliness campaigns were also undertaken during the special camp. Anti-Drug Awareness Rally was also conducted "No to Drugs, Yes to Life". During this camp NSS volunteers visited nearby slum areas

and presented a nukkad natak on the "Importance of Water Conservation". In this camp students take part in various cultural activities like group song, Nati, Bhangra, Haryanvi dance, Rajasthani dance, semi-classical dance, mime on 'Overuse of Mobile Phone' and skit on 'Importance of Hygiene Education' Under regular activities, Environment conservation programmes were organised under the global mass movement Mission LIFE(Lifestyle for Environment). International Yoga Day, Kargil Vijay Divas, NSS Day, National Unity Day and Constitution Day were also celebrated. Four cleanliness drives were organised in the college campus. Meri Mati Mera Desh programme was celebrated on 9th August, 2023 under the theme "Mati ko Naman –Veeron ka Vandan". In this programme a plantation drive was also organised in the college campus to aware students to contribute towards rich and healthy environment. Mock drill on fire safety was also organised in the college campus on 10th October, 2023 collaboration with the Fire Station, Una . Amrit Kalash Yatra under Meri Maati Mera Desh Campaign was organised in the college campus on 12th October, 2023

Rashtriya Uchhatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)

The college receives a magnanimous grant under the RUSA project. Major funding under this project is coming under Equity Initiative Programme of RUSA. Many new infrastructural facilities are being created in the college from the RUSA fund. This grant program focuses on providing financial support to educational institutions to address infrastructural gaps, improve academic standards, and promote overall excellence in higher education.

Expenditure:-

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Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)

To advance and disseminate learning and knowledge by diversity of means without any bias to all sections of society, the Learner Support Centre 1109 of Indira Gandhi National Open University at Govt. P.G. College, Una was established in 1996. The continuous efforts put in by Regional Directors, Principals, Coordinators, Counselors, Staff and the hard work of learners for the last 25 years has resulted in continuous growth of this centre as a result of which it has emerged as one of the largest study Centre in Himachal Pradesh in terms of learners' strength. At present this center is operational with Dr. Meeta Sharma as Coordinator and Prof. Rakesh Kumar and Dr. Rajinder Kumar as Assistant Coordinators. In the current session 2542 students have been enrolled. The center conducts induction meetings, counseling, assignment evaluation, term end examinations, and provides extension and support facilities for its learners.

This study Centre provides distance learning facilities to all those who are deprived of regular studies

LIBRARY, PTA & OSA

Library

The college library stocking a prodigious collection of 23500 books, subscription of 25 journals 13 magazines and 14 newspapers, endeavors to be a repository of knowledge. It is playing a vital role in educating students to become skilled, effective and responsible information users so that they know how to use it effectively, efficiently and ethically. The library resources are being automated using SOUL library software. An NLIST service, the e-resources provided by the INFLIBNET, has been subscribed for the use of faculty and students. Digital section of the library is operational where Virtual Learning Resource Centre with excellent State- Of –The-Art computer facilities having 6 Internet connected terminals with Local Area Network (LAN) have been installed.

Parents Teachers Association (PTA)

A Parents Teachers Association is functioning smoothly in the college under the Presidentship of Sh. Tilak Raj. The PTA, through its invaluable support makes a positive contribution in sustaining the quality of educational transactions that take place in the college. Their constructive criticism and valuable feedback have always been helpful and appreciated. In the current session, renovation of Maa Saraswati cabin was undertaken. The PTA fund has been utilized for the

purchase of printer for installation in the Pol.Science Department. Beautification, white wash, repairs and cleanliness of the campus was also done by using PTA fund. Besides, the fees of around 72 poor students was given out of PTA fund.
